








The Need for Robust Equity Tools

Interventions not designed for equity



Many indicators and tools for addressing equity not reliable

Neglects process or outcomes
Neglect social-cultural context
Lack of transparency
Conflicts of interest
Vague definitions
Accountability gaps between proponents and affected communities

Diagnose, anticipate, evaluate adverse effects to plan against them







Anti - Inequity Intervention Assessment Structure











Cumulative (Dis)Advantage – IA Affected by History

 - IA processes inherit historic inequities






Case Study: Cumulative (Dis)Advantage and Welleaning Development





Case Study: Cumulative (Dis)Advantage and Sellinterest

Equity, Sustainable Development, and IA

Equity is the focus of sustainable development, but most ocean interventions not designed for equity

Many proponents and advocates try to make the case that meeting their self-interests are good for the world

Assessment and evaluation:

- Recognizing cumulative (dis)advantage
- Protect against conflict of interest and misaligned indicators
- Forecast harms to plan against them
